About ShadAnywhere

ShadAnywhere is a transformational month-long STEAM and entrepreneurship program in July for Grade 10 and 11 students. The program is offered through a digital campus where students participate online from wherever they're spending their summer. ShadAnywhere affords students an amazing opportunity to prepare for post-secondary education, participate in university level lectures and labs, and hear from professional keynote speakers and knowledge keepers. The program runs from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 25, 2025

About the Role

As a Campus Coordinator Design and Community, you will be contracted to be part of the leadership team for one campus of the ShadAnywhere program, accountable to the Campus Lead. You will be responsible for supporting the safe and effective day-to-day operation of one cohort, including supporting campus logistics in an online environment.

In this role, you will be responsible for supporting a team of facilitator as they mentor Shad participants through a pre-planned human-centred design process. The Campus Coordinator will assist in troubleshooting activities and templates, as well as supporting facilitators with team dynamics and design questions. The role also involves setting up Miro (an online collaborative whiteboard space) with pre-made templates.

You will use your technical and problem-solving skills to maintain a smooth-running program. You will be contracted to perform this multifaceted role with a focus on facilitating a safe, inclusive, and engaged community. You will support the Campus Lead and play a key role in daily program logistics.





Here's what you'll do:

- Provide logistical support for a digital program to deliver on Shad's intended impacts.
- Support facilitators in leading a small groups through a human-centred design process
- Set up Miro (an online collaborative whiteboard) for up to 8 design teams, and support facilitators and participants in Miro troubleshooting
- Support campus activities (e.g., monitor online spaces, host Zoom calls, ensure accuracy of campus schedule, update daily documents, oversee community projects).
- Report and consult with the Campus Lead regarding any participant and/or parent/guardian concerns.
- Support the Campus Lead in implementing Shad's risk management policies, procedures, and best practices at the campus cohort level to ensure the safety and well-being of program participants.
- Be present in digital program activities, which may include lectures, workshops, and communitybuilding activities, as needed.
- Attend/complete program-specific training to be held virtually ahead of the program.
- Post-program, submit a feedback report.

Time Commitment:

The Campus Coordinator must have the following availability:

May-June:

Available for

- Virtual training in June 2024, to be scheduled in the spring, including June 28-29, 2025
- Supporting pre-program preparation and administration

July:

- Campus operations and administration, in addition to the synchronous hours below, activities may include:
 - Logistical support
 - Campus resource management
 - Supporting the resolution of participant and/or parent/guardian concerns
 - Duties related to campus administration
- Participate in daily campus synchronous sessions Monday Friday (9:30 18:00 ET). Daily sessions may include:
 - Campus sessions, including lectures, facilitator workshops, virtual field trips, and communitybuilding
 - Small group design-entrepreneurship sessions
 - Team meetings and leadership meetings





- Alongside the Campus Lead, foster a collaborative and inclusive team culture that provides support and encouragement to all team members.
- Ensure participant accommodations and supports are implemented

You bring:

A mindset for safety, inclusion, and community – the well-being of Shad participants and Team Members is always our topmost priority during the program. You take the initiative to implement community-building and risk-management frameworks and have a keen eye for monitoring the emotional well-being of participants and the Shad community as a whole.

Excellent attention to detail – in collaboration with the campus leadership team, you will oversee campus logistics across several virtual platforms for one campus cohort of the ShadAnywhere program. Attention to detail will be key in creating an efficient and effective program to achieve Shad's intended impacts.

You also have:

- Strong organizational skills
- Experience working with youth
- Experience working or facilitating online through collaborative platforms (e.g., Miro, Zoom, Microsoft Teams, Google Suite, Topia, etc.).
- Experience facilitating human-centred design processes
- Experience fostering positive team dynamics
- Understanding issues that can arise in an online environment and experience implementing risk management policies
- Strong problem-solving skills
- Diverse and well-rounded experiences and interests, which include community service, volunteer work, and extracurricular activities.
- Reached the age of 18 years old
- Are legally eligible to work in Canada
- Completed or are completing a post-secondary degree program. Recent graduates with industry and/or STEAM experience are also of interest

Please note successful candidates will be required to have a Police Vulnerable Sector Check completed prior to starting team member training.
