As 2024 draws to a close, we're taking a moment to reflect on all that has been accomplished across the CASC network this year. Here's our **top 5 list of accomplishments** (in no particular order):

- 1. We welcomed over **10 new members** into the CASC community.
- 2. We flowed through over **\$700,000 in microgrants** to CASC members through the GenAction and SUF initiatives.
- 3. We hosted over **30 Community of Practice meetings** for educators and programmers, GenAction Partners, the 2024 total solar eclipse, Together Against Misinformation micro-grant recipients, and the Indigenous CoP gathering.
- 4. **Together Against Misinformation Week**, the first ever week-long national campaign hosted by CASC's ScienceUpFirst initiative, was a tremendous success. Over 40 events were hosted by collaborators across Canada, over 800 posts were shared from over 450 unique authors and CASC hosted two national conversations in Calgary and Montreal with over 1200 registrants.
- 5. The GenAction initiative surpassed its goal, **reaching over 200,000 youth** including **5,724 Indigenous youth.**

As we head into 2025, we are really excited about the new opportunities we've got planned for our members, staff and growing ecosystem of collaborators and supporters. We can't wait to dive into new programs, microgrants, and deep learning journeys, all of which are being guided by our **strategic plan** and our commitment to advancing Canada's science and innovation culture.

To be eligible for funding in fiscal years 2026-27 and 2027-28, Initial Recipients must be qualified through the 2025-26 Call for Proposals.
