CASC is now accepting applications to **The Niiganii Miinigowiziiwin (We Give These Gifts to the Future) Accelerator Program** – a transformative, collective learning journey to support CASC Members as they grow relationships with local Indigenous communities and engage more deeply with Indigenous Knowledge Systems.

Based on transformative systems change practices, this program is designed for CASC members who are somewhere along their journey of strengthening relationships with local Indigenous communities and have started down the path of braiding Indigenous wisdom into their operations, outreach and education initiatives.

This first-of-its-kind program will be facilitated by Systems Changer in Residence and world-renowned Indigenous Systems Scholar **Dr. Melanie Goodchild**, Vice President of Indigenous Knowledge, Scholarship and Research at Shingwauk Kinoomaage Gamig and

Founder of the Shingwauk Indigenous Knowledge Systems Lab, in partnership with the globally-recognized **Presencing Institute** and systems change leaders at **Wolf Willow Institute**. Upon completion of the Accelerator Program, participants will be granted a micro credential from **Shingwauk Kinoomaage Gamig**.

> code Béluga: A collaborative science project on biodiversity in the St. Lawrence

Espace pour la vie and Génome Québec are inviting the public to take part in a collaborative science activity aimed at better understanding the state of biodiversity in the St. Lawrence Estuary by analyzing the environmental DNA contained in a simple water sample. At the heart of this project is the beluga whale, Quebec's emblematic sentinel species.

Following a protocol established by Génome Québec, and with the support of the Biodôme's education team, the public is invited to come and take water samples containing environmental DNA. These samples will then be analyzed at the Centre d'expertise et de services Génome Québec. The results will be available for research and for the public.

> Pacific Museum of Earth awarded national grant for Mineral Journeys digital outreach project

Pacific Museum of Earth has been awarded a Digital Projects grant from Digital Museums Canada to develop *Mineral Journeys*, an interactive online learning experience for Canadian classrooms. Featuring six minerals from our mineral collection—including critical minerals like lithium, cobalt, and copper—the project will use a choose-your-own-adventure format to follow each mineral's geologic formation, global movement, and human use across time and place. Users will explore the interconnections between Earth systems and human activity, along with the social and environmental challenges tied to mineral extraction and use. Mineral Journeys was one of only eight projects selected from over 100 applications this year—and the only science-based initiative funded.
