

> G7 GovAl Grand Challenge - open for proposals

Canada is proud to announce that it is hosting the **G7 GovAl Grand Challenge**, an international initiative designed to accelerate Al adoption in the public sector.

This challenge invites participants from G7 and EU countries—including students, researchers, public servants, and members of civil society, academia, and industry—to join a series of Rapid Solution Labs focused on solving real-world public sector problems using AI.

Participants will work individually or in teams to develop scalable solutions to key barriers facing governments. Selected proposals may receive up to \$10,000 CAD in support, with dedicated funding streams available for participants aged 13-17 and 18-29 years old.
